

Welcome to our annual Parampara 2025 student showcase!

This year we celebrate the 60th birthday of the Pandit Ram Sahai Sangit Vidyalaya (PRSSV) Institute of Performing Arts and Heritage. PRSSV was established in 1965 in the ancient city of Benares and has been a registered charitable trust in the UK since 1987. Our teaching ethos is "learning through doing" and our students perform regularly, finding new ways of experiencing and making music.



SPIRIT OF SANGEET



Sangeet is a collective term for the coming together of instrumental music, vocal music and dance.

The Natyashastra (also known as the "Sangeet Natya Shastra") is considered a foundational text for Indian classical dance and drama. It is attributed to the ancient scholar Bharata Muni. The text details performance techniques, theatrical principles, and the rules for music, dance, and drama. It outlines the importance of "Abhinaya" (literally, "carrying to the spectators") which involves connecting the artists and the audience through body language, speech, mind, and scene, where actors communicate to the audience through song and music.

The Natyashastra has influenced various Indian artistic traditions, highlighting the sophistication of ancient performances. It continues to be a valuable resource for understanding and practicing Indian classical dance and drama

PRSSV's PARAMPARA

Provides a major platform for our students to perform to a live audience giving them invaluable experience. It also serves as an opportunity to showcase how Indian classical music is growing momentum in the UK. PARAMPARA literally means 'proceeding from one to another' and refers to the tradition of Guru-Shishiya (Teacher-Student/Disciple) passing on knowledge and tradition through the ages.



PANDIT SHARDA SAHAI



Pandit Sharda Sahai (1935-2011) was born in Benares and was a direct descendent of Pandit Ram Sahai, the founder of the Benares style ("Gharana") of Tabla playing. With the inherent gift in his blood of the finest traits of the Benares Baaj, he began at an early age to learn tabla from his father, the late Pandit Bhagvati Sahai. Following his father's demise in 1946,

he became a disciple of the inimitable Pandit Kanthe Maharaj, himself a disciple of Sharda Sahai's grandfather, Pandit Baldeo Sahai.

Sharda Sahai started his professional career at the age of nine, performing both as a soloist and as an accompanist. He made his major public debut when he was sixteen, appearing at the Italee Music Conference in Calcutta with the sarod maestro Ali Akbar Khan. His professional activities in India have included appearances as soloist and accompanist at all of the important music conferences and festivals as well as performances with every major artist of North Indian classical music. He was awarded "A Grade Artist" status by All India Radio in 1965. Also in 1965 he founded the Pandit Ram Sahai Sangit Vidyalaya, an institute for training in classical music and dance, located in Benares.

Sharda Sahai has performed over one thousand concerts worldwide. His solo performances have been broadcast on All India Radio's prestigious National Program. His accompaniment experience includes every major artist of North Indian classical music- among others: sitarists Ravi Shankar, Vilayat Khan, and Nikhil Banerjee; sarodists Ali Akbar Khan and Amjad Ali Khan; violist V.G. Jog; and dancers Gopi Krishna, Birju Maharaj, and Sitara Devi.
